Hi, everyone! It's Kate here, and it's time for me to share my latest travel recommendations with you. Now, if any of you out there are looking for a cheap holiday, you could try the Bristol Hotel in Malta. I went back there last week, after a gap of nearly ten years. The Bristol has a large unheated swimming pool, but it is only suitable for adults as it's two metres deep. There's also a gym which would be lovely but it wasn't open. I spoke to a member of staff and apparently, it's been out of order since March and they're still waiting for an engineer to come and repair it. There used to be a small restaurant in the hotel serving local food, but that has closed, unfortunately.

Luckily, there was plenty to do in the evenings. The little streets behind the hotel are full of restaurants and bars, where you can meet local people and there is a very popular night market where you can buy delicious snacks. If you want something more exciting, you can take a local bus or taxi to the centre of Golden Bay, about five kilometres away. Here there are lots of night clubs, discos and a casino. During the day, you can do various water sports, including fishing, snorkelling and scuba diving.
