When I was growing up, my favorite toy was my bike. Luckily, because of where I lived and because my parents let me have a lot of freedom, I could ride it a lot. I remember coming home from school and going out on my bike to the park, or just around the neighborhood. Now I'm a parent myself, and I worry that children can't play outside in the same way I used to. There is so much more traffic — it just isn't safe for them to ride their bikes by themselves. I decided to start a "Playing Out" session on my street. We close the road for three hours once every two weeks. Then the children can play on the street, like I used to. They ride bikes, they skip, they draw on the road with chalk. It's amazing. Some local residents weren't sure about it at first, but now they can clearly see the benefits. Even people who don't have children come onto the street and join in. "Playing Out" *is* really difficult to organize because you need permission from the local government to close the road and you need at least four adults to be responsible for the children, but it's definitely worth the trouble.

You could always tell I was going to be an engineer. I loved construction bricks, even when I was very small. That's one of the best things about the toy, of course. It doesn't matter if you've got tiny hands, you can still build a castle, or a car, or a robot ... and then you can make something completely different with the same pieces. Some boxes of bricks come with a set of instructions to help you build a particular plane or building. I would build them once, and then all the pieces went into a big plastic tub in my bedroom. I spent many hours building my own creations. I think construction bricks have changed since I was little. There are more specialized pieces, like different wheels and connectors. And I really don't think there should be "pinkified" boxes of bricks "for girls," where the colors are different and the specialized pieces are flowers and pets. They should be banned!
