Computer specialists develop and maintain the computer equipment and software programs that form the basis of the Internet. Computer programmers write, test, and customize the detailed instructions, called programs or software, that computers follow to perform various functions such as connecting to the Internet or displaying a Web page.

Computer software engineers analyze user needs to formulate software specifications, and then design, develop, test, and evaluate programs to meet these requirements. While computer software engineers must possess strong programming skills, they generally focus on developing programs, which are then coded by computer programmers.

Computer systems analysts develop customized computer systems and networks for clients. They work with organizations to solve problems by designing or tailoring systems to meet unique requirements and then implementing these systems. By customizing systems to specific tasks, they help their clients maximize the benefit from investment in hardware, software, and other resources.



Computer support specialists provide technical assistance to users who experience computer problems. Using automated diagnostic programs and their own technical knowledge, they analyze and solve problems with hardware, software, and systems. In this industry, they connect with users primarily through telephone calls and e-mail messages.

Kellogg's

John Harvey Kellogg was a skilled surgeon and health food pioneer. He created a biscuit of oats, wheat, and corn.

Kellogg's brother, Will Keith Kellogg, worked with him to come up with breakfast items more wholesome and easier on the bowel than meat. They experimented with boiling wheat and rolling it into sheets, then grinding it. One evening, in 1894, they forgot about a pot of wheat and the next morning, rolled it out anyway. The wheat **berries** didn't cohere into a sheet but rather emerged as hundreds of flakes. The Kellogg's toasted the flakes... and the rest is breakfast history.

W.K. Kellogg was something of a marketing genius. When his brother didn't want to take risk – fearing it would damage his reputation as a doctor – Will bought him out and, in 1906, packaged wheat flakes for sale.

Puffed Cereals

Quaker Oats, the oldest hot cereal company, having been founded on the success of oatmeal, acquired puffed-rice technology in the early 20th century. Cheerios (puffed oats), Sugar Smacks (sugary puffed corn), Rice Krispies, and Trix wandered far from the healthful aims of America's early breakfast cereal brands.

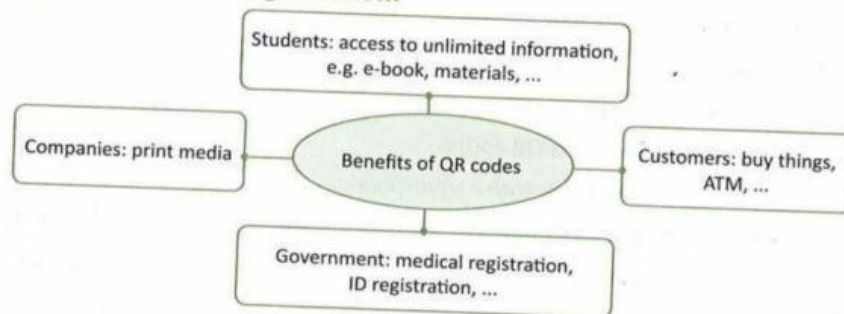
