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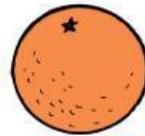

The farmer drives a tractor. The tractor digs up the ground. He plants reds tomatoes, potatoes, lettuce, onions, and yellow corn in the ground.

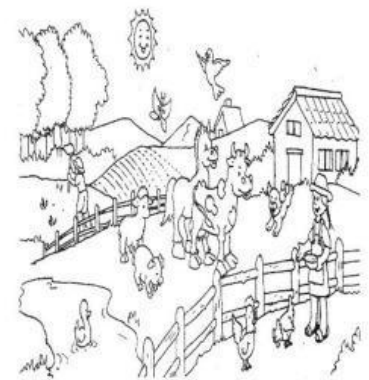
