ENGLISH FOR IT

/id/	/t/	/d/
This is the LEAST common -ed sound WORDS THAT END WITH /t/ or /d/ sound	Words that end in /p/ /k/ /f/ /s/ /sh/ /ch/ sound	This is the most common -ed sound - Words that end in any other sound (vowels are included here)
Implement -> /'implə,mentɪd/ /'implə,mentəd/	Patch -> /pætʃt/	Save -> /seɪvd/
Decided -> /dɪ'saɪdɪd/	Check -> /tʃekt/	Open -> /'oʊpənd/
Start -> /stɑrtɪd/	Asked -> /æskt/	Secure -> /sɪ'kjʊəd/

VIT:

VERY IMPORTANT TIP



If the sound at the end:

- Vibrates -> /d/
- If not -> /t/

Example

REMEMBER THAT YOU HAVE TO ANALYZE THE **BASE FORM** OF THE VERB:

SAVE

the last **sound** is /v/. Does it vibrate? Yes, it does.

So the pronunciation is with /d/ -> /seɪvd/
