You have probably never heard of Charles Burgess Fry (1872-1956), but in England he was the greatest all-round sportsman of his time, and perhaps of any time. He became famous while still at university, mainly on account of his achievements in sport. He was at the same time captain of the university football, cricket and athletics teams and held the world record for the long jump. He was also a popular sports journalist. He was so famous that letters addressed to Mr. Fry Oxford were delivered to him without any difficulty. His college, although it had quite a different name, was known as Fry's College.

Some people have **criticized** Fry's sporting achievements. They point out that he lived at a time when standards were quite low and it was much easier to do well in several sports. It is certainly true that athletes of that time did not have the totally dedicated approach of modern athletes. However, it is fair to judge him by the standards of his own time. There is no doubt that he had extraordinary skills combined with an ability to write about sports with style and intelligence.

It is normal for you to feel **jittery** when you are being interviewed for a job, particularly in a stress-producing situation. In fact, there are many jobs where a little nervousness isn't looked at askance. Right before attending the interview, it does help to dry a damp brow or clammy hand, but otherwise, don't be too concerned about the outward manifestations of your nervousness. Experienced interviewers will **discount** most physical signs of nervousness. The only one that people have a hard time ignoring is a fidgety hand. Interviewees who constantly twist their hands or make movements that are dramatically distracting are calling to their nervousness.

Remember that during the interview, employers talk to the applicant in order to determine whether or not he or she is suitable for the job, not because they enjoy embarrassing uneasy applicants. One way to overcome a flustered feeling, or "**butterflies in the stomach**", is to note that interviewers want to evaluate potential employees and select the most desirable applicants. If employers think you fit into their company or organization, you will be the one who is sought after. An interview also allows the candidate to assess the corporate culture and demands of the job. It is almost as if you are interviewing them to see if they are good enough for you.
