

VINCENT VAN GOGH (1853-1890)

Vincent Van Gogh was born in 1853 in the Netherlands. He was Dutch¹.

He had two brothers and three sisters. He was very close to his younger brother Theo.

Vincent wrote him a lot of letters and we know many things about his life because of that. Theo sent him money and encouraged him.

He started painting when he was 28 years old but he painted around 2.100 artworks², including around 860 oil paintings. He painted many of his best pictures in the last two years of his life.

He travelled across Europe (Belgium, England, France).

At the beginning he used **DARK COLOURS** (browns, black, dark green) to express the sadness³ of poor handworking people ("The Potato Eaters" is an example).

He moved to France when he discovered Impressionism and became friends with the famous painter Paul Gauguin. After arguing with him he cut off a piece of his own ear.

In Arles (a town in the South of France) he began to use **BRIGHTER⁴ COLOURS** and developed⁵ his unique style: broken, separate brushstrokes⁶, using complimentary colours (see "The Yellow House", "The Bedroom", "Sunflowers").

He was very poor. He sold only one painting during his life and he became famous after his death.

He suffered from mental illnesses and painted his most famous artworks while he was in a mental hospital.

He painted flowers, himself (self portrait)⁷ and landscapes⁸ because he was too poor to pay models.

He died in 1890 and his death may or may not have been a suicide.

- ✓ Third version, end September 1889. Oil on canvas, 57.5 x 74 cm, Musée d'Orsay, Paris
