Digital Literacy

The ability to recognize when information is needed and to have the ability to locate, evaluate, and use effectively the needed information (ALA, 1989).

Web Literacy

The multiple ways of communicating and making meaning, including such modes as visual, audio, spatial, behavioral, and gestural (New London Group, 1996).

New Literacy

The use of new technologies to gather and communicate information (Coiro et al., 2008).

Multiliteracies

The ability to find, evaluate, utilize, share, and create content using information technologies and the Internet (Cornell University, 2009).

Information Literacy

The knowledge and use of specific skills needed to locate, analyze, and communicate information found online.
