-  I will use what I know instead of always translating on computer or asking for translation.
-  I will study in class and at home.
-  I will make flashcards or other study aids to help me remember words.
-  I will speak English as much as I can with my friends.
-  I will look and listen for cognates and other clues to meaning.
-  I will be honest and not cheat or plagiarize (copy others' work.)
-  I will ask for help when I am confused.
-  I will do my best to learn and cooperate in the learning process.
