There + The Verb Be, Some & Any

- We use **there is** for singular nouns and noncount nouns.
- We use **there are** for plural nouns.
- We use **some** in positive sentences and **any** in negative sentences or in questions.

	Singular / Noncount	Plural
Positive	There is a cup. There is some milk.	There are some cups.
Negative	There isn't a cup. There isn't any milk.	There aren't any cups.
Question & Answer	Is there a cup? - Yes, there is . / No, there isn't . Is there any milk? - Yes, there is . / No, there isn't .	Are there any cups? - Yes, there are . - No, there aren't .



There is a glass on the table.
There isn't any milk in the glass.
There is some water.



Are there any cherries in the basket?
- No, there **aren't**.
There are some strawberries.
