Use <i>There is</i> and <i>There are</i> to talk about things that you can see or that exist.	
Statements	Questions
There is a beautiful park in Springfield. There isn't a park in Livingston.	Is there a beautiful park in Springfield? Yes, there is .
There are people in the park. There aren't <u>any</u> ducks in the park.	Are there any ducks in the park? No, there aren't .
Use <i>any</i> with negative statements or with questions that use plurals or uncountable nouns.
