Martin Luther King Jr. was an important leader in the fight for civil rights in the United States. He was born on January 15, 1929, in Atlanta, Georgia. King was a Baptist minister who believed in peaceful protest, inspired by his Christian faith and the ideas of Mahatma Gandhi.

King became well-known for leading events like the Montgomery Bus Boycott and the March on Washington. During the March on Washington, he gave his famous "I Have a Dream" speech, calling for an end to racial discrimination and equal rights for everyone.

In 1964, King received the Nobel Peace Prize for his efforts to fight racism and promote peace. Unfortunately, he was assassinated on April 4, 1968, in Memphis, Tennessee. Martin Luther King Jr.'s work continues to inspire people around the world in the fight for equality and justice.
