Flat bodies that fit the contours of the sea floor are good for fish that live there. These fish have evolved in very different ways, and there are two main types. A family member of sharks, skates, and rays have become flat in a way that might be called obvious. Their bodies have spread out to make big "wings." The shapes are still the same and they look like they were flattened, but they are still "the right way up." On the other hand, fish like plaice, sole, and halibut have changed how they've become flat. They are much "taller" than they are wide. There are bony fish that tend to be flattened in a vertical direction. They use their whole flattened bodies as swimming surfaces, which move back and forth in the water as they swim. So, when their ancestors moved to the seabed, they lay on their sides instead of their bellies. One eye was always looking down into the sand, though, so it wasn't doing anything useful. In evolution, **this** problem was fixed by the lower eye "moving" around to the other side. This process of moving around can be seen in the growth of all young bony flatfish. It starts out swimming near the surface and is flattened and symmetrical in the vertical direction. But then the skull starts to grow in a strange, asymmetrical, and twisted way, so that one eye, say the left eye, moves over the top of the head and up, giving it an old Picasso-like look. By the way, some species of 20 flatfish settle on the left, some on the right, and some on both sides.

Water is essential for life and makes up most of the tissues of all living things. One of the biggest challenges for desert animals is to stay alive in a world with few sources of flowing water. A man must always take in large amounts of water on a regular basis, so it's hard for him to understand how many animals in the desert live their whole lives without drinking a drop.

Even though it is harsh, the desert has not killed all living things; **it** has only killed off those that couldn't handle how dry it is. Animals with wet skin and a love of water can't live there. Not many big animals can be found. The bobcat, the coyote, and the deer are the big animals of the North American desert. Because the desert is open, it has more animals that can run and jump quickly than the dense forest. Its people are mostly active at night, are quiet, are shy, and are very good at being sneaky. Still, they are not skinny. They are as healthy as animals anywhere else in the world because they have learned to live in such a harsh environment. The key to their ability to adjust is how their behavior and bodies work together. They would all die in minutes if they went outside in the middle of the day, like crazy dogs and Englishmen.

Because of this, most of them sleep in cool, damp burrows underground during the hot hours and only come out at night to hunt. A desert that is baked in the sun is about 150 degrees on top, but only 60 degrees 18 inches below the surface.
