-The Imperative is the Infinitive without **to**.

Affirmative: Sit down!

Negative: Don't sit down!

-We use the Imperative in:

- **Instructions:** Open your books.
- **Warnings:** Look out!
- **Offers:** Have some juice.
- **Advises:** Stay at home. Don't go to school if you are ill.
- **Requests:** Pass the sugar, please.
- **Invitations:** Come for dinner.
