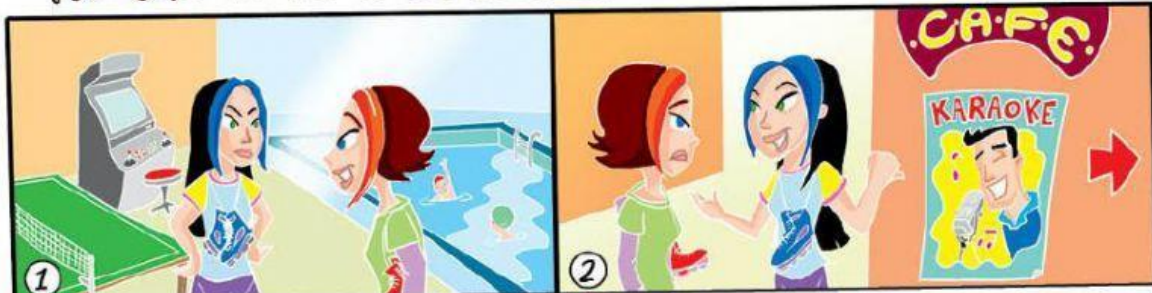

You can dance	You cannot/can't dance	Can you dance?	Yes, you can.	No, you can't.
He can dance	He cannot/can't dance	Can he dance?	Yes, he can.	No, he can't.
She can dance	She cannot/can't dance	Can she dance?	Yes, she can.	No, she can't.
It can dance	It cannot/can't dance	Can it dance?	Yes, it can.	No, it can't.
We can dance	We cannot/can't dance	Can we dance?	Yes, we can.	No, we can't.
You can dance	You cannot/can't dance	Can you dance?	Yes, you can.	No, you can't.
They can dance	They cannot/can't dance	Can they dance?	Yes, they can.	No, they can't.

We use **can**:

- to express ability: *He can swim.*
- to ask for permission: *Mum, can I go out?*
- to give or refuse permission: *Yes, you can. / No, you can't.*
- to make a request: *Can I speak to Paul, please?*

The verb **can** is a modal verb. It doesn't take an -s in the third person singular, it doesn't form the negative and question form with *do/does*, and it is always followed by the base form of a verb.
