The brothers catch a fish



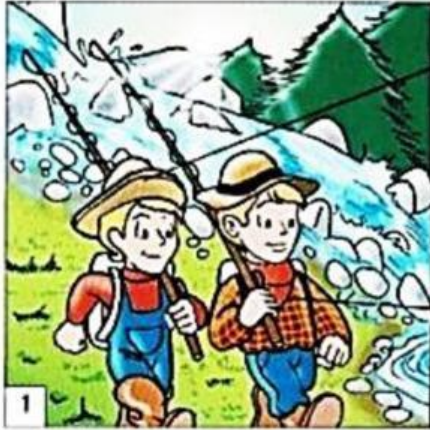
1. In the first picture, Jim and Charlie are going fishing. They are walking beside a river. They both look happy.

4. In the 4th picture where are the boys now? Who is with them? Where's the fish? Are they happy in the end?

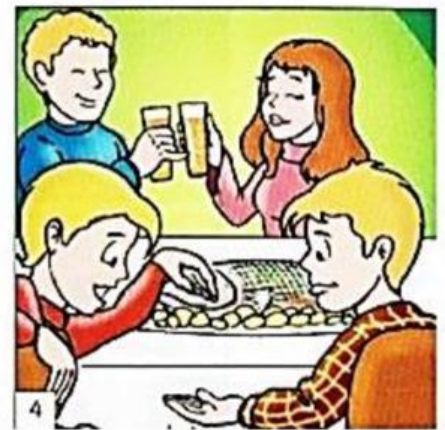
