A children's shoe shop took a survey of their customers shoe size over one day. Here is a list of their responses.

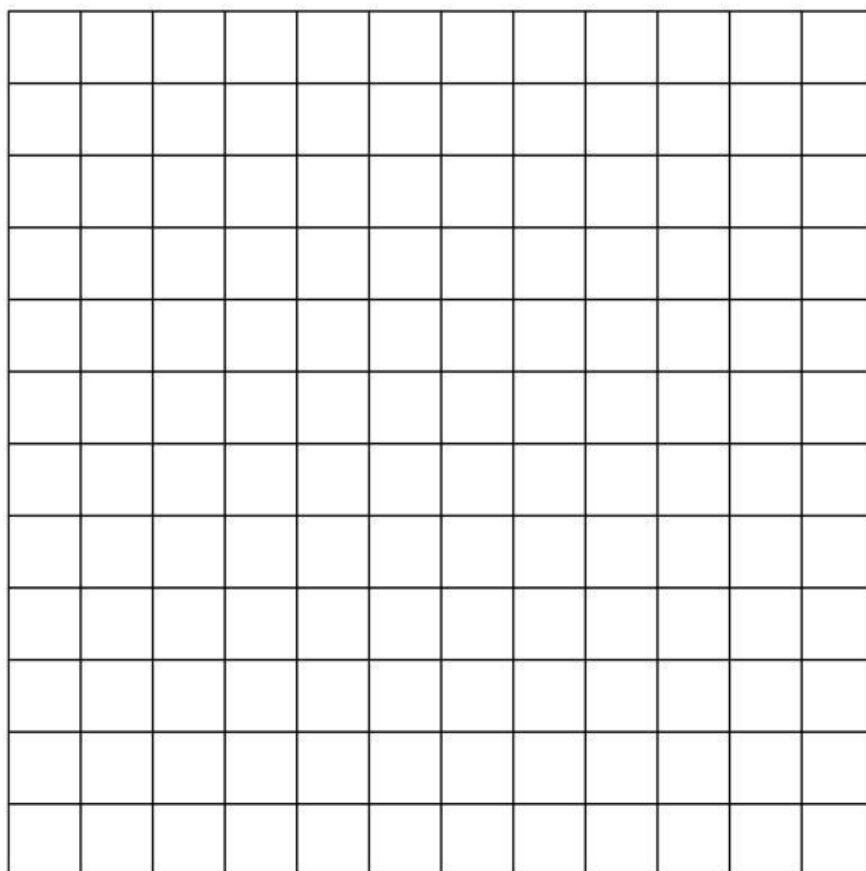
