



Present Simple with Adverbs of Frequency

We use adverbs of frequency and adverbial phrases to talk about how often an action happens.

Examples include: always, usually, often, sometimes, occasionally, never, every Monday evening, twice a year.

- Adverbs of frequency usually come after and auxiliary verb:

Ex. We **don't usually** cook on a Sunday.

- They also come after the verb to be

Ex. He **'s rarely** at home at the weekends.

- They come before all the other verbs.

Ex. I **occasionally** download music.

- Usually, often, sometimes and occasionally can also come at the beginning or end of a clause in spoken English.

Ex. **Sometimes**, we get home early. / My friends call me **occasionally**.

- Longer adverbial phrases usually come at the end of a clause.

Ex. I play tennis with Abi **once a week**. / I go shopping **every Friday**.
