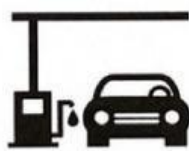

Difference between "Shop" & "Store"

SHOP	commonly used in British English	Shops are small and provide a particular type of product or a service.
STORE	commonly used in American English	Stores are big and sell variety of products.

Present Continuous Tense

Functions: 1. to describe happening actions at the moment of speaking
2. to describe future plans

Declarative & Negative Form: Subject + is/am/are (not) + V-ing...

Interrogative Form: Is/Am/Are + Subject + V-ing...?

Examples: - Andrew is going to a bus station. He is booking a ticket to Bangkok.
- We are not flying to Tokyo. We are not having a meeting there.
- Is Sandra driving to a garage? Whom is she going with?
