This statue was the largest indoor sculpture ever built. It was built by the Greeks in honour of their king of Gods, Zeus.



This was the first lighthouse built in the world. It was built off the coast of the city of Alexandria. It took 20 years to build.



King Nebuchandnezzar II created an artificial rooftop garden for his wife. The plants hung from the walls of the terraces.



This statue was built in honour of the sun God, Helios in Rhodes Greece. It took 12 years to build.



This temple was built in honour of the Greek goddess, Artemis. It took 120 years to be built.



They are the oldest and the only surviving structure of the seven Ancient Wonders of the world.



This tomb was built by Queen Artemisia in honour of her husband, king Mausolus of the city of Halicarnassus.
