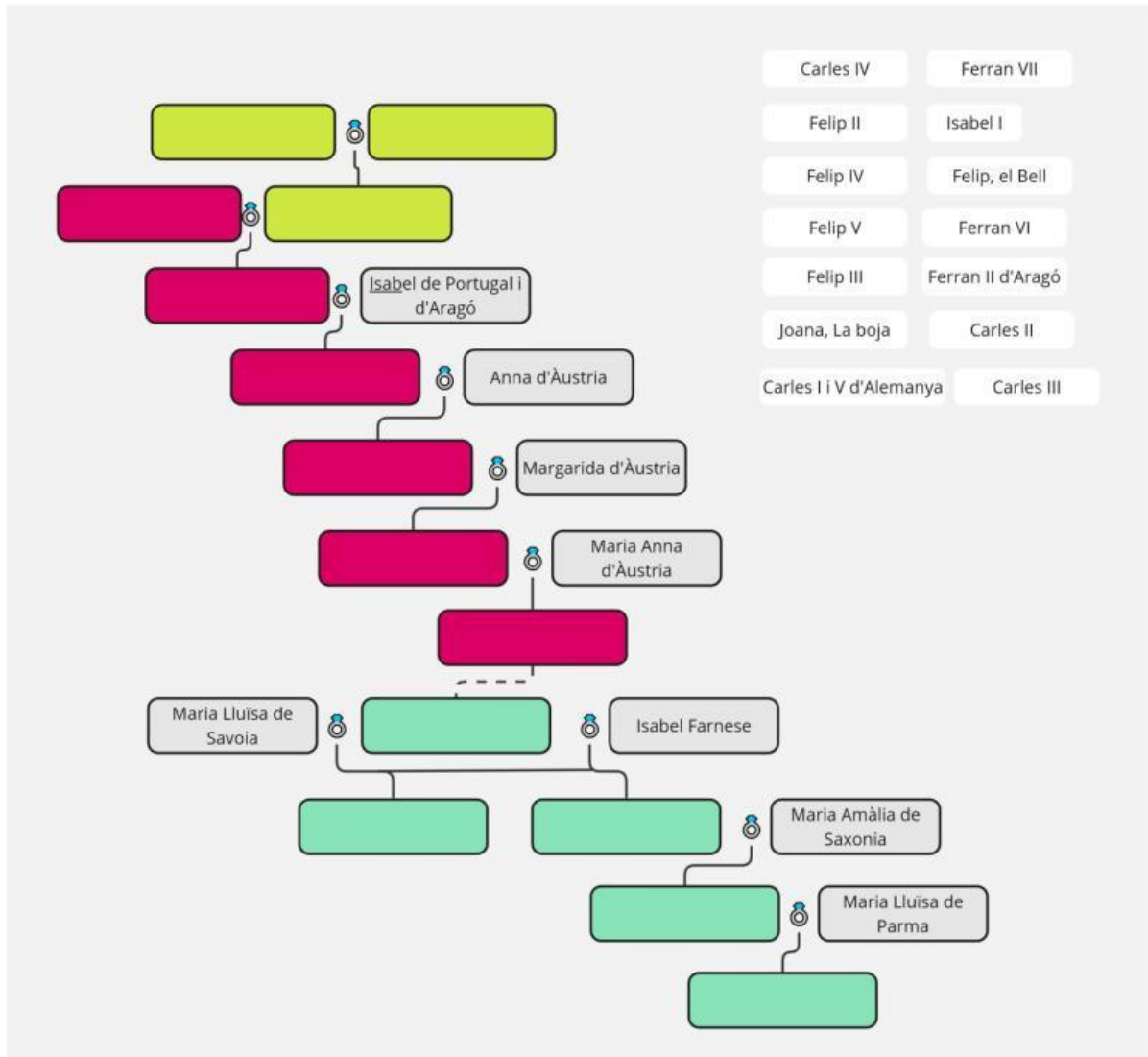
- Population decreased
