## From Shocking to Striking

### Tattoos Gain Acceptance

**J**ust as fashions come and go, standards for appropriate dress continue to change. This change is often accepted by some sooner than others. What is attractive or trendy in one situation may be seen as shocking or tacky in another. In Western society, tattoos are an example of this.

Fifty years ago, a tattoo was a symbol of nonconformity. A person with a tattoo was seen as devious and offensive. This began to change in the 1960s, as many standards for dress, grooming, and behavior began to change. Rock 'n' roll musicians were among the first to wear tattoos as a way to rebel against society's rules. Eventually, athletes, models, and movie stars also began to wear tattoos.

Today, tattoos are seen on all types of people. For many teenagers, tattoos are an expression of individuality and self-confidence. Smaller, more subdued tattoos are hardly even noticed.

It is too early to say that tattoos have achieved total social acceptance. A tattoo could still be a "career-killer" in more conservative professions such as banking or finance. However, plenty of people are now entering the business world with tattoos they got as students. Eventually, these people will become business leaders, and the style will be more acceptable. When we see a tattoo on a president or prime minister, we will know that tattoos have finally arrived.
