Living in La Paz

I arrived in La Paz about a week ago – has it really been that long? – and as soon as I stepped off the plane, I realized it would be a ‘once-in-a-lifetime’ experience. Travelling from a European country and crossing the Atlantic is something to remember and talk about, anyway. But getting used to living so high above sea level challenged me most – and still does!

La Paz is the highest capital city in the world and it’s almost 3,650 metres above sea level, which for an islander like me is unusual. Having studied engineering and urban architecture, I was fascinated by its location. It’s built in a large valley near the beautiful mountain Illimani – every day I wake up to the sight of its snowy peaks!

The first few days I had to stay in bed, as I suffered from terrible headaches and stomach ache. Of course, that’s all normal at this altitude. However, I could only do minimal work from home, which of course didn’t impress my employers. I’ve only just started going to the office, which has improved my mood, as I’ve had the chance to meet some great co-workers.

Max is one of them and, so far, he’s been my closest friend. Not that the others aren’t friendly. It’s just that language can come between us sometimes. My French is fluent and that’s one of the reasons I got the job – my English being the second! I’ve only just started learning Spanish, and Max is fluent in both French and English. That’s allowed us to get to know each other better.

The other day, we did some training with the so-called ‘traffic zebras’. This is a programme aiming to tackle traffic accidents here in La Paz. It turns out that drivers here often don’t stop at zebra crossings and many citizens don’t even know what they are! So a few people dressed up as zebras and walked on zebra crossings to show that drivers had to stop for pedestrians to cross.

To get there, we had to go to El Alto, a city next to La Paz. That sounds easy, doesn’t it? Well, it isn’t, and that’s because there’s a difference of 400 metres in altitude between them. So there’s no underground and the only way to travel was by bus on very busy and tough streets. Then the cable car was built. Here it’s known as ‘Mi Teleférico’ (a lovely name meaning ‘my cable car’) and it’s made travelling a lot easier. You get to travel in the air and look around the city of La Paz from above. I can’t wait to get on it again!
