This garment is treated using industrial dyeing processes that give it a 'lived in' look. Do not use solvents. Wash separately inside out at 30°C. Dry the garment inside out and do not expose to sunlight. Steam iron.



Machine wash cold on gentle cycle with like colours. Only non-chlorine bleach when needed. Remove promptly from wash while still damp. Hold both ends, twist tightly and knot. Tumble dry low. Do not iron.



Dry clean only. Do not machine or hand wash. Do not spin or twist. Low or steam iron only.



The special finish of this pure cloth has original irregularities to bring out the natural aspects of the weaving and artisan dyeing process. A gradual change in colour is characteristic of this process. Wash separately with like colours at 30°C. Line dry, and iron on high.



Wash by hand using mild detergent. Do not wring garment. Lay flat to dry and reshape. Do not dry clean.
