Part 1: Rules of Capitalization

1. The First Word of a Sentence: Always capitalize the first word of a sentence.

Example: The dog is barking.

2. Proper Nouns: Capitalize names of specific people, places, and organizations.

Example: I visited London and met Alice.

3. Days, Months, and Holidays: Capitalize days of the week, months of the year, and holidays.

Example: Monday, January, Christmas.

4. Titles: Capitalize the main words in titles of books, movies, and songs.

Example: I love the movie The Lion King.

5. Nationalities and Languages: Capitalize names of nationalities and languages.

Example: She speaks Spanish and is Mexican.

6. The Pronoun 'I': Always capitalize the pronoun 'I'.

Example: I went to the store.
