LEARNING TO LEARN: GRAMMAR

Learning prepositions in English

Prepositions are one of the hardest things to learn in English because there are no firm rules. However, even though they are generally small and may seem unimportant, they can make a big difference in meaning. For example:

*It's the story **by** Mary Shelley.* (= She wrote it.)

*It's the story **of** Mary Shelley.* (= It's about her.)

Collocations are words that generally go together. Exams such as the Cambridge B2 First test your knowledge and usage of collocations with prepositions. The best way to learn them is to learn phrases rather than single words, for example:

*I'd like **information about** ..., I'm having **difficulty with**..., and I feel **sorry for***

This will make it more likely that you will use the correct preposition and that your meaning will be clear.
