

First vs. Zero Conditional

⇒ The **zero** conditional describes what happens **in general**.

⇒ The **first** conditional describes a **particular situation**.

- **If you sit in the sun, you get burned:** Here I'm talking about every time a person sits in the sun - the burning is a natural result of sitting. >**ZERO COND.**
- **If you sit in the sun, you'll get burned:** Here I'm talking about what will happen today, another day might be different. >**FIRST COND.**

GENERAL: zero cond.
