FREQUENCY ADVERBS: ALWAYS) USUALLY OFTEN SOMETIMES NEVER POSITION: Before the verb. Example : I always get up at 6:00	
TIME EXPRESSIONS: IN THE MORNING / AFTERNOON / EVENING EVERY DAY EVERY SUMMER / WINTER ... ON THE WEEKEND ON MONDAYS / FRIDAYS... POSITION: At the end of the sentence Beginning * Example : I get up at 6:00 every day .	TIME EXPRESSIONS: YESTERDAY / LAST NIGHT LAST WEEK / MONTH / YEAR LAST FRIDAY / SATURDAY TWO DAYS AGO / THREE WEEKS AGO... IN 1998 / IN 2017... POSITION: At the end of the sentence. Beginning * Example : I got up at 6:00 yesterday . Yesterday I got up at 6:00.
