Don't forget the **rules** for **comparatives** and **superlatives**!

	Comparatives	Superlatives
	Short adjectives → (adj.) –er + than	Short adjectives → the + (adj.) –est
	Long adjectives → more + (adj.) + than	Long adjectives → the + most + (adj.)
"y" → "i"	Ex. Easy → easier (than)	Ex. Heavy → the heaviest
c-v-c + c	Ex. Hot → hotter (than)	Ex. Fat → the fattest
Good	Better (than)	The best
Bad	Worse (than)	The worst
Far	Farther / further (than)	The farthest / furthest
