| 4. <i>Get over</i>             | Criticize someone repeatedly         |
| 5. <i>Get on</i>               | throw away/ dispose of               |
| 6. <i>Get away with</i>        | do something naughty                 |
| 7. <i>Get at</i>               | solve                                |
| 8. <i>Get rid of</i>           | Have good relationship with          |
| 9. <i>Get out of</i>           | Get to                               |
| 10. <i>Get your point over</i> | Avoid being punished                 |
| 11. <i>Get through to</i>      | recover from                         |
