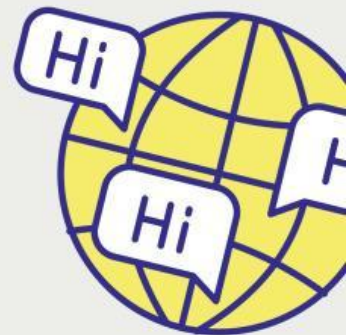

Lastly, ChatGPT can create dependency. Students who use it too often might struggle to complete tasks without its help. This can become a big problem during exams or real-life situations where ChatGPT is not available.
