Today we're pleased to have on the show Alice Bussell from the Dolphin Conservation Trust. Tell us about the Trust, Alice.

Well, obviously its purpose is to (1) _____ in seas all around the world. It tries to raise people's awareness of the problems these marine creatures are suffering because of (2) _____ and other threats. It started ten years ago and it's one of the fastest growing animal charities in the country - although it's still fairly small compared with the big players in (3) _____. We are particularly proud of the work we do in (4) _____ - last year we visited a huge number of schools in different parts of the country, going round to talk to children and young people aged from (5) _____.
