Top tips to save money

- Going to the movies? Don't buy snacks at the theater. Go to a store to buy **them** before you go.
- A "2-for-1" deal isn't always a *good* deal. When a store offers two big bags of chips for \$5.00, and a single bag is \$3.00, you save \$1.00, and *that's* great! Or is it? If you didn't need all those chips, then you paid \$2.00 for something that you didn't really want.
- Better to borrow than buy. If you only need to wear something once – for example, a suit for a job interview – ask a friend to lend you **one**.
- Don't join a gym! If you're going to exercise just once a week, don't waste money on an annual subscription. It's usually cheaper to pay for each fitness class.
- Go grocery shopping in the evening. That's when supermarkets have sales on many items, and you can fill your cart with more for less!
