Next, pour or scoop the batter onto the griddle. When the bottom of the pancake starts to turn a golden brown color, turn it over to cook on the other side. Once the pancake is golden brown on both sides, put it on a plate to cool.

- C. Turn the pancake out into a plate for serving.
