Adventures in the air

The first ever balloon flight carrying passengers was made by the Montgolfier brothers in 1783. They used hot air to float the balloon **(16)** _____. Nowadays, people still fly in hot-air balloons, but there is also a less well-known sport called 'cluster ballooning'; instead of one big balloon, **(17)** _____.

Cluster ballooning was invented by a lorry driver called Larry Walters. Larry had wanted to fly using balloons for a long time. In fact, he was just a boy when he first started thinking about it.
