.....tells a story or an event. • It could be tale, novel, an account of one's life, natural phenomena, or social events...

.....writing explores, shares, explains, or defines a specific subject or idea. This type of writing does not include the writer's opinion or tell a story; its goal is not to persuade, and the writer's voice should be neutral

.....attempts to get readers to accept a point of view or the writer's position on a topic.

## Quiz : Part of Paragraph

**Direction:** Write the name each of part of paragraph in the space properly

\_\_\_\_\_ : also called the body of the paragraph, are used to support, explain, illustrate, or provide evidence for the idea expressed in the topic sentence.

\_\_\_\_\_ : is the most important sentence in a paragraph. Sometimes referred to as a focus sentence, the topic sentence helps organize the paragraph by summarizing the information in the paragraph.

\_\_\_\_\_ : They are cues that help the reader interpret your ideas. Transitional words or phrases help carry your thoughts forward from one sentence to another and one paragraph to another. Finally, transitional words link sentences and paragraphs together smoothly so that there are no abrupt jumps or breaks between ideas

\_\_\_\_\_ : Every paragraph should include a topic sentence that identifies the main idea of the paragraph. It also states the point the writer wishes to make about that subject.

\_\_\_\_\_ : wraps up the paragraph and ties back to the topic sentence. A conclusion could be a reiteration of the topic, an opinion based on the topic, or a way to wrap up the paragraph with a more general statement.
