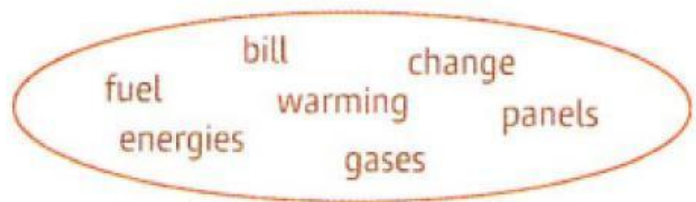
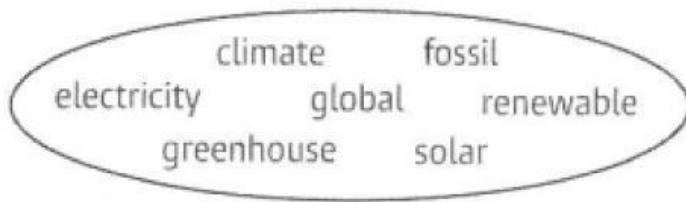

Big Oil: From Black to Green

Mark Nowicki installed solar panels on his roof last week, joining millions of American homeowners and businesses **embracing** renewable energy. With federal tax **incentives** and **declining** installation costs, solar energy has become a **mainstream choice**. He uses solar power as a backup during **outages** and to cut electricity bills, with the added benefit of reducing his **carbon footprint**.



However, what Nowicki may not realize is the **broader shift** happening in the energy industry. His solar panels were produced by NextEra Energy, now one of the world's largest renewable energy firms. Traditional oil giants like TotalEnergies, Shell, and BP have also intensified their investments in solar, wind, and battery storage, reshaping the energy sector.

Over the past decade, major oil companies have made record investments in renewables. TotalEnergies, which **acquired** a majority stake in SunPower in the early 2020s, has now committed over \$10 billion annually to clean energy projects. Similarly, BP and Shell have expanded their portfolios, targeting net-zero emissions by 2050.

The shift is **driven by** growing global climate commitments and stricter regulations on **carbon emissions**. In 2024, global renewable energy capacity **surpassed** fossil fuels for the first time, marking a significant **milestone** in the transition to **sustainable energy**.

At the same time, oil and gas companies face a **crucial** decision: Should they **accelerate** their transition to renewables or maintain their **reliance** on traditional fossil fuels? Some firms, like ExxonMobil and Chevron, remain **committed to** oil and gas, banking on sustained global demand. Others, like Equinor and Ørsted, have repositioned themselves as leaders in offshore wind and hydrogen technology.

Despite this transition, the world still relies heavily on fossil fuels. Global energy demand continues to rise, especially in emerging economies. The question remains whether oil giants will successfully balance profitability with sustainability or if new energy players will take the lead.

One thing is certain: The decisions made by Big Oil today will shape the future of energy, the economy, and the climate for decades to come.
