Using wish

1. Wish about the present and future

I wish I spoke Italian.

1.1 wish + _____ is used to express that we **want** a situation in the present (or future) to be different.

Circle the correct one!

- A. He wishes he finishes his work.
- B. He wishes he finished his work.



- A. I wish I can be the one you love.
- B. I wish I could be the one you love.

- A. I wish you were here.
- B. I wish you are here.



I wish it weren't raining.

1.2 wish + _____ is used to express that we **want to be doing** a different action in the present (or future).

Circle the correct one!

- A. I wish I am lying on a beach now.
- B. I wish I were lying on a beach now.



- A. I wish we were having a luxurious dinner now.
- B. I wish we are having a luxurious dinner now.

2. Wish about the past

I wish I hadn't been to Paris with you.

2.1 wish + _____ is used to **express a regret**, or that we **want a situation in the past to be different**.

Circle the correct one!

A. I wish I hadn't eaten so much.
B. I wish I haven't eaten so much.



A. We wish he'd come on holiday with us.
B. We wish he's come on holiday with us.
A. I wish I have studied harder at school.
B. I wish I had studied harder at school.

3. Wish + would

I wish you would stop smoking.

3.1 wish + _____ + _____ is used to **express impatience, annoyance, or dissatisfaction with a present action**.

Circle the correct one!

A. She wishes it will stop raining.
B. She wishes it would stop raining.



A. I wish she'll be quiet.
B. I wish she'd be quiet.

Using hope**I hope it is sunny tomorrow.**

_____ is used to express that you want something to happen in the future (**not wanting a situation to be different, and not implying impatience or annoyance**) **hope** is used instead of **wish**. (Structure: **hope** + _____ + _____)

Circle the correct one!

A. I hope she passes her exam next week.
B. I hope she pass her exam next week.



A. I hope the plane doesn't crash tomorrow.
B. I hope the plane wouldn't crash tomorrow.
