POSITIVE

SUBJECT	+	WAS/WERE	+	PRESENT PARTICIPLE
I / He / She / It	+	was	+	playing
You / We / They	+	were	+	eating

Positive examples:

I was playing football. • She was eating chocolate. • They were fighting.

NEGATIVE

SUBJECT	+	WAS/WERE NOT	+	PRESENT PARTICIPLE
I / He / She / It	+	was not	+	playing
You / We / They	+	were not	+	eating

Contractions: *wasn't / weren't*

Negative examples:

I wasn't running. • He was not helping. • We weren't feeling very well.

QUESTIONS

Was	+	I / he / she / it	+	playing?
Were	+	you / we / they	+	eating?

Questions examples:

Were you drinking my milk? • What were they doing? • Was it raining?

PAST CONTINUOUS

We use the **Past Continuous** for actions in progress in the past.

POSITIVE	NEGATIVE	QUESTION
I / He / She / It was playing.	I / He / She / It wasn't playing.	Was I / he / she / it playing?
We / You / They were playing.	We / You / They weren't playing.	Were we / you / they playing?
