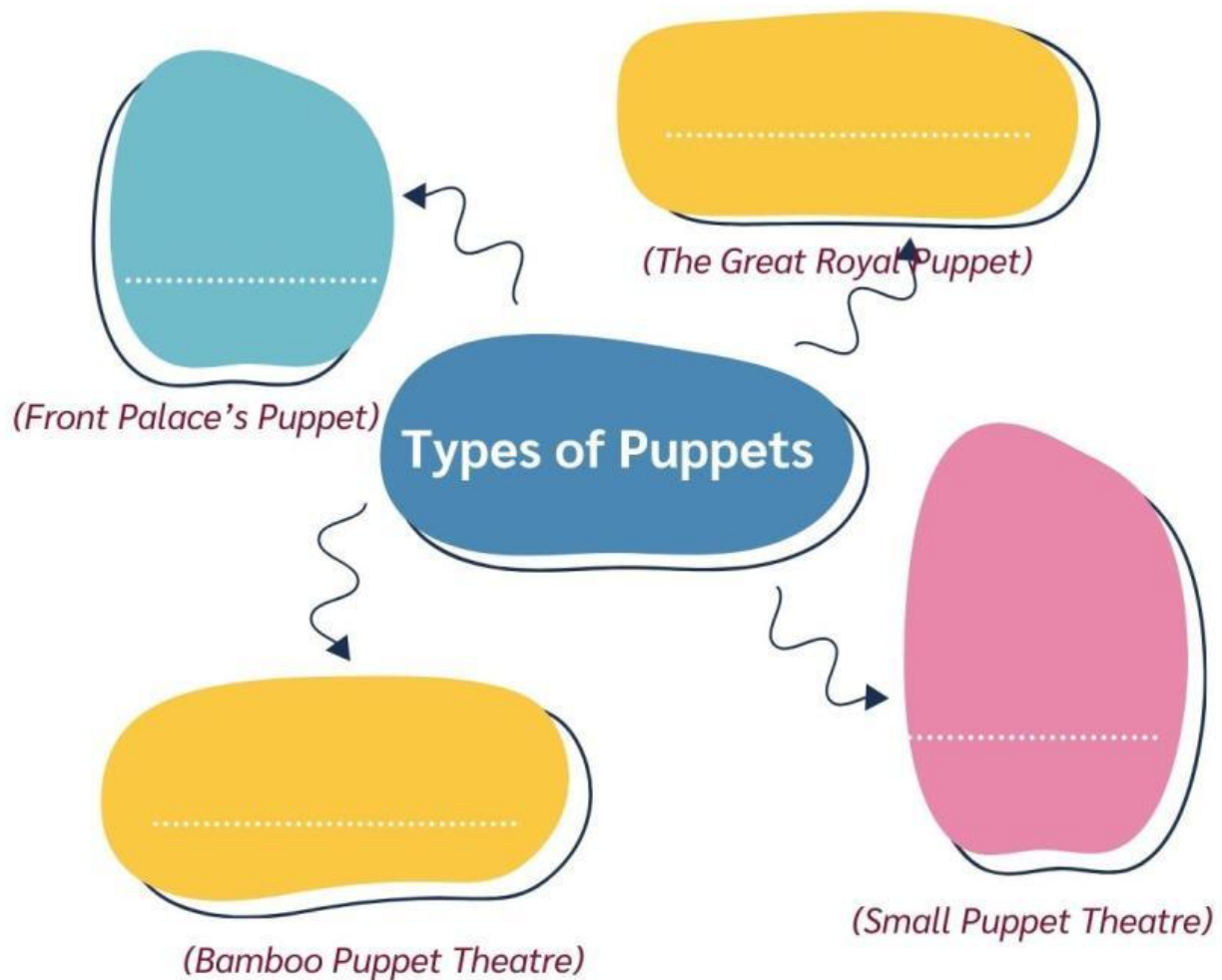


Thai Puppet: The Science Art of Performance
