Madisen: Are you from Australia too, Liam?

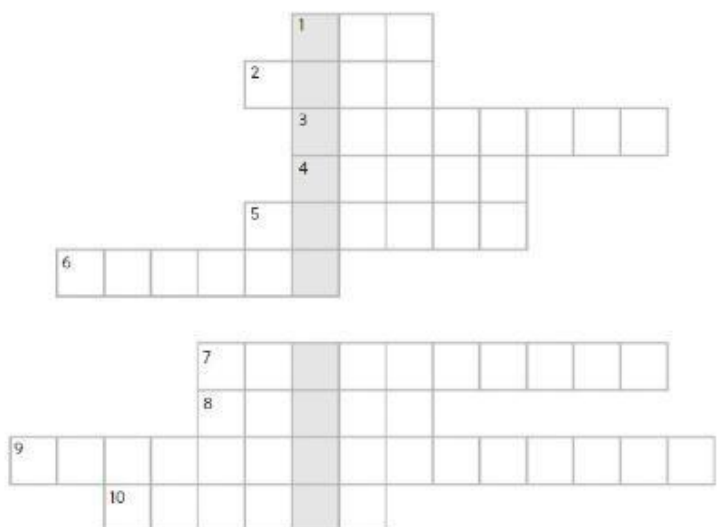
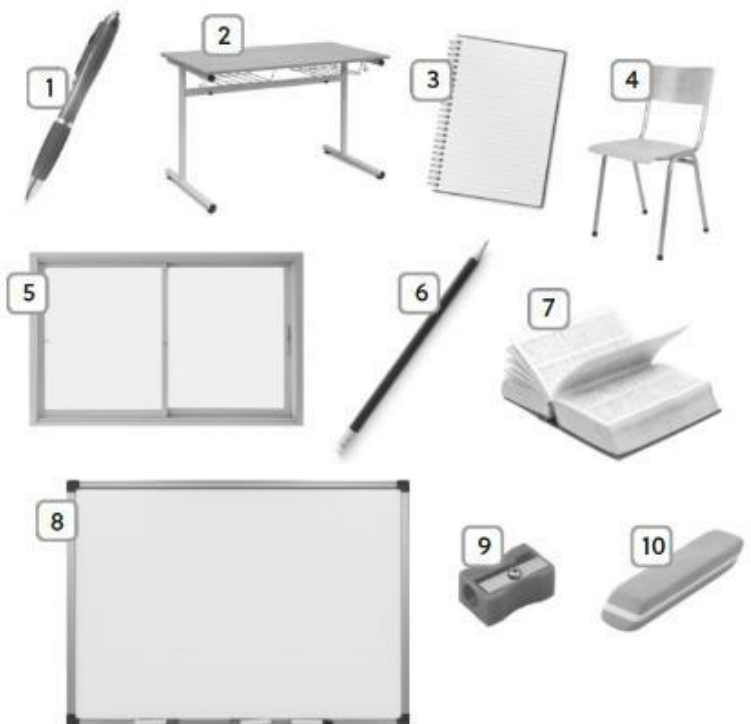
Liam: No! I'm from New Zealand but my parents are British.
