Tracks

In 1975, Robyn Davidson, a young woman from Australia, decided to travel 2,700 kilometres from Alice Springs across the harsh Australian deserts to the Indian Ocean with her dog and four camels.

Before her trip, she worked on a farm for two years and learnt how to train camels and how to survive in the desert. She met a photographer from National Geographic magazine, Rick Smolan. He suggested asking the magazine to give her money in exchange for her story. The money was enough for her to pay for her trip and Rick told her he would meet her along the way to take photos for the magazine. She set off in 1977.

On the trip, she met some native Australians. One of them, Eddy, agreed to go with Robyn as a guide through some sacred lands. He taught her about Aboriginal life and medicine and they became great friends. Then, she continued alone.

Robyn spent the next two months travelling across the hot desert. The sun was burning her skin and it was very difficult. Her dog, Diggity, died and she was very lonely. She almost gave up, but then after 157 days of travelling she arrived at the Indian Ocean and she and her camels ran into the water.

Robyn wrote the article for National Geographic to go with Rick's photos in 1978. She also wrote a bestselling novel about her journey called Tracks in 1980 and they made her story into a film starring Mia Wasikowska in 2013.
