

Can for Requests / Permission

The word "can" is a modal verb that we use to:

Make a polite request

When we want someone to do something for us.

- Can you open the window?

Ask for permission

When we want to do something.

- Can I ask you a question?
- Can I sit here?

When answering polite requests, we usually use special phrases.

To reply 'Yes' you can say:

- Sure / Of course.
- No problem

To reply 'No' we might say:

- I'm sorry, (give reason).
- No, I'm sorry, I can't.
