

CHAPTER 6 Stress in Words with Suffixes

OBJECTIVES

In this chapter, you will learn:

- where to stress words with common suffixes.
- the pronunciation of longer, multisyllable words, especially academic, scientific, and technical terms.
- more about vowel sounds in stressed and unstressed syllables.

SUMMARY

Some common suffixes, such as *-er*, *-ment*, and *-able*, do not affect word stress:

em-**ploy** em-**ploy**-er em-**ploy**-ment em-**ploy**-a-ble

Other common suffixes, such as *-ic*, *-ity*, and *-ion*, shift the stress in predictable ways.

spe-ci-fy

spe-**ci**-fic

ma-jor

ma-**jor**-i-ty

ap-**ply**

ap-**pli**-ca-tion

As you learned in Chapter 5, the vowel sounds in stressed syllables are clear and long. The vowel sounds in unstressed syllables are usually short and reduced to the schwa /ə/ sound: *specific* /spə'sɪ fək/.



TIP ▼ Pronunciation and Physical Movement

Movement or physical activity can help reinforce the essential contrast between vowels that are stressed and lengthened and vowels that are unstressed and shortened. A wide, thick rubber band is an excellent tool for practicing stress and vowel length in this chapter.*
