The Great Barrier Reef

The Great Barrier Reef, located off the coast of Australia, is the largest coral reef system in the world. It stretches over 2,300 kilometers and is home to thousands of marine species, including fish, turtles, and sharks. The reef is made up of tiny organisms called coral polyps, which build limestone structures over time. These corals provide shelter and food for many sea creatures, making the reef one of the most diverse ecosystems on Earth.



However, the Great Barrier Reef faces serious threats. Climate change has caused ocean temperatures to rise, leading to a phenomenon known as coral bleaching. When corals are stressed by high temperatures, they lose their vibrant colors and become weak. Pollution from human activities, such as plastic waste and chemicals, also harms the reef. Scientists and conservationists are working hard to protect this natural wonder by creating marine protected areas and encouraging eco-friendly tourism.
