BOTH ... and ... - plural (2 things)

Both the legal **and** finance departments will share the meeting room.
I like **both** suppliers, the one from China **and** the one from India.

EITHER ... or ... - singular (2 things)

Either today **or** tomorrow works for me to meet the client.
It can be today **or** tomorrow; **either one** works for me to meet the client.

NEITHER ... nor ... - singular (2 things)

Neither Jack **nor** Carol is fit for this position.
Neither of them is fit for the job. We should appoint Ann to this position.

NONE ... - singular/plural (3 or more things)

None of my team members speaks either French or German.
Of all my team colleagues, **none** speak any foreign language.
