→ Past Progressive

We usually use the Past Progressive for an action that:

1. was in progress at a particular time in the past.
 2. took place over a long period of time in the past.
 3. was happening at the same time as another action in the past.

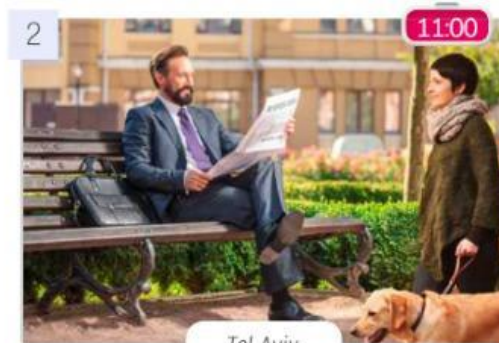
