refers to a specific owner:

mine, yours, my, hers, his, its, your, etc.

A relative pronoun

connects a phrase to a noun/ pronoun:

who, which, that, whom, etc.

An indefinite pronoun

doesn't refer to anything specific:

all, any, each, some, several, etc.
