Phonetic transcription: \kɔll/
Distinctive features for: \k/
Your vocal cords do not vibrate.
chicken, book, accident.

Sentence sample:
I'll call you tomorrow.



3.BAKE

Phonetic transcription: \beyk/
Distinctive features for: \k/
Your vocal cords do not vibrate.
break, picture, sick.

Sentence sample:
He has to bake bread



4. AGAIN

Phonetic transcription: \əgen/
Distinctive features for: \g/
Your vocal cords should vibrate.
forget, game, began.

Sentence sample:
He kissed her again.



5. GAS

Phonetic transcription: \gæs/
Distinctive features for: \g/
Your vocal cords should vibrate.
gift, bag, egg.

Sentence sample:
The car ran out of gas.



6. GIVE

Phonetic transcription: /gɪv/
Distinctive features for: /g/
Hold a piece of paper or your hand in front of your lips to make sure air is released.
grape, glass, goal.

Sentence example
Give a book to someone who needs it.



7. FOOD

Phonetic transcription: /fuwd/
Distinctive features for: /f/
Your vocal cords do not vibrate.
free, refer, fun.



Sentence sample:
I've no food left in the house.

8. AFFORD

Phonetic transcription: \əfɔrd/
Distinctive features for: \f/
Your vocal cords do not vibrate.
phone, stuff, tough.



Sentence sample:
I can't afford a new car.

9. CHIEF

Phonetic transcription: \tʃiɪf/
Distinctive features for: \f/
Hold your hand in front of your lips to feel the flow of air as you hear it.

fast, feel, few.

Sentence sample:
He is the chief of my department.



10, VOICE

Phonetic transcription: \vəys/

Distinctive features for: \v/

Produce the sound by forcing air out through the opening. Do not stop the flow of air.

verb, over, give.

Sentence sample:

I want to hear your voice



11. DRIVER

Phonetic transcription: \drayvər/

Distinctive features for: \v/

Your vocal cords should vibrate.

view, save, live.

Sentence sample:

She is a taxi driver.

Phonetic transcriptions: \keyv/


Distinctive features for: \v/

14. MATH

Distinctive features for: $\backslash\theta/$

Your vocal cords do not vibrate.
theme, death, booth.

15. PATH

Phonetic transcription: $\backslashpæ\theta/$

Distinctive features for: $\backslash\theta/$

Produce the sound by forcing air out through the narrow opening between your teeth and tongue.

thirty, healthy, fifth.

Sentence sample:

16. SMOOTH

Phonetic transcription: /smuɔð/

Distinctive features for: /ð/

Your upper teeth rest on your tongue, lightly.

this, they, brother.

Sentence sample:

The ride is smooth and quiet.



17. ANOTHER

Phonetic transcription: \ənəðər/

Distinctive features for: \ð/

Hold your hand in front of your lips to feel the flow of air as you hear it.

father, southern, clothe.

Sentence sample:

Would you like another coffee?



18. BATHE

Phonetic transcription: \beyð/

Distinctive features for: \ð/

Your vocal cords should vibrate.

mother, brother, other.

Sentence sample:

It was too cold to bathe.



19. SAFE

Phonetic transcription : \seyf/

Distinctive features for: \s/

Raise the front part of your tongue toward the front part of the hard palate, but do not touch it.

so, cent, scene.

Sentence sample:
You'll be safe here.



20. SAD

Phonetic transcription: \sæd/

Distinctive features for: \s/

Press the sides of your tongue against the upper teeth.

missing, decide, race.

Sentence sample:
David was looking sad.



21.PLACE

Phonetic transcription: \pleɪs/
Distinctive features for: \s/
Your vocal cords do not vibrate..
kiss, cease, seal.

Sentence sample:
The place is empty.



22. FREEZER

Phonetic transcription: \friːzər/
Distinctive features for: \z/
Press the sides of your tongue against the upper teeth.
zero, dizzy, noisy

Sentence sample:
There's cream in the freezer for dinner.



23. PAUSE

Phonetic transcription: \pɔːz/
Distinctive features for: \z/
Your vocal cords should vibrate.
buzz, these, cries.

Sentence sample:
There was a pause in the conversation.



24. CRAZY

Phonetic transcription : \kɹeɪzi/

Distinctive features for: \z/

Point the tongue tip toward the upper gum ridge, but do not touch it.

zip, zinc, zing.

Sentence sample:

In the end it's crazy.
