The third conditional is used for **unreal situations in the past**.

It is also used for **dreams that will not come true**.

IF CLAUSE = PAST PERFECT <i>If I had won the lottery,</i>	MAIN CLAUSE = WOULD + HAVE + PAST PARTICIPLE <i>I would have travelled the world.</i>
RESULT = WOULD + HAVE + PAST PARTICIPLE <i>I would have travelled the world</i>	IF CLAUSE = PAST PERFECT <i>if I had won the lottery.</i>
